Albert Lee needs no introduction to country music and rock fans, fronting his own band *Hogan's Heroes*, including some of the best known and most respected rock'n'roll and country musicians in Britain. He has six solo albums to his credit and five albums with *Hogan's Heroes*. Their principal trumpet player has recently returned from a trip to Venezuela where he worked with the renowned
